



## Tile and Countertop Caulking

Areas that will typically require attention are surface transitions (for example, corners, seams, or other connection points) in your tiled showers and countertops. A good seal in these areas is needed to avoid water penetration and leaks.

Examples of area that should be checked are below:

### **Tile Surface Settlement**



### **Granite Backsplash Settlement**



If any cracks or breaks in the caulk or grout are observed, follow these simple steps:

**Step One:** Allow the area to fully dry out from the last use or exposure to water.

**Step Two:** Scrape clean the existing caulking with the assistance of cleaners or removing agents to clear out any of the existing material.

**Step Three:** Apply a silicone-based caulk using a consistent bead to avoid gaps or breaks in the application.

**Step Four:** Let dry for the recommended time noted on the product of choice.
